SENATOR JANSSEN: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm smarter, and I just looked at his amendment. And here I am, not having talked to anybody about it, don't know what went into the developmental discussion that led to Senator Bourne's amendment. Then I have the audacity, which I'm known for, to come here and tell my colleagues, you better do what I tell you to do. I'd think about it long and hard if I were you, brothers and sisters, and I would reject this amendment. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You've heard the opening on the amendment AM1605 to AM1601. Next, the first light on is Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Senator Janssen, members of the Legislature. Senator Chambers, let me tell you, I'm getting ready to ask a question. I understood this was not a stratagem and the reason I raise the question is this. As you know, under the rules, if we adopt your amendment to this amendment, that means that the underlying amendment cannot be withdrawn, so it does have a significant rule or implication. Senator Bourne has a different form of his idea, which accomplishes, I think, the argument you're making, which is to make sure that there is no obligation for the fair to be in a city. I think that's the fair characterization of the goal of the language that you've offered. You might be able to look on your gadget to find it, because what it says...would say is this. It says that the 10 percent shall be transferred to the State Fair Board if the most populous city within the county in which the fair is located, which means that it can be any place within the county, that's the goal that you have with your language, provides matching funds equivalent to 10 percent of the funds available for the transfer. Such matching funds may be obtained from the city and other private or public entity. My point being that the goal that you wish to raise is achieved in the language, I think, that Senator Bourne would like to substitute, but if we do your amendment we can't substitute because we can't withdraw that amendment and put this one in.
