SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Bourne, will you respond?

SENATOR BOURNE: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Mr. President, members. Want to be cautious, Senator Chambers, but since 6:00 tonight you've had some very wise ideas pop into your head, most of which I agree with. I think I'm going to...I want to...I hope Senator Bourne's amendment will go. I'm going to wait back for that, not FA1601 but the one you have drafted, Senator Bourne. I think the 10...the match is a good idea and I think a broadening the base of support. But what I really want to talk about is the attendance of the Nebraska State Fair. I heard some rather disparaging remarks about attendance. But we had, even in 2003, which some...I've heard some discouraging words about there, were 238,000; 2002, 284,000; 2001, 300,000; 1999, 367,000. It's, admittedly, declined, but the fact of it is there's lots and lots of people in this state voting with their feet. They're voting with their feet in coming to the Nebraska State
