Fair. The figures I have show that a big chunk are from Lancaster County, 44 percent, but there's 15 percent from Omaha and the remaining 41 percent from the balance of the state. And I would dare say that if it hadn't been...if there wasn't a September fest, the Omaha Offutt air show, all those things going on simultaneously, I think there's another event at the Memorial Park in Omaha, that there probably would have been more from Omaha. I think the citizens of the state, even if they are two or three generations removed from agriculture, still appreciate their heritage to the extent that they will come to the Nebraska State Fair when it is properly run. I think back a few years ago. In many ways, I saw this coming and I did have several meetings in my office, I think it might have been as far back as 1994, 1996, the way time flies, trying to resolve the issue of the Lancaster County Fair pulling out and going out east of town. I was unsuccessful and I kick myself to this day the fact that I wasn't more firm in trying to resolve that issue, because I think there should have been a way so that could have been resolved cooperatively and we would have some of the...we would be less divisive today in the support of the State Fair and the facilities that are out there. But it didn't happen and I've resolved to do some things different in the future if ever I got into that because, in many ways, the State Fair went downhill from there. And I think it does need a chance to be revived, and I think with new blood and new ideas and the reorganization that happened last year under, I think it was LB 1241, can't remember the bill number, there will be new ideas and new blood injected, and that's what anything takes to make it go. And there are State Fairs around this country that are very, very successful, and the rest are fairly successful to very successful, and they are more in urban areas than even the state of Nebraska. So I'm not going to give up hope on the Nebraska State Fair, and I think this one...this amendment is one...or this constitutional amendment is one way to get there. Obviously, it's not perfect, and if there was some other options I might consider them. But this, to me, is one I'm going to have to hang my hat on at this point, and I urge the rest of you to stay the course. Thank you.
