You ride 'em, you get sick, so it's better to watch them anyhow, get more thrills out of it. But, anyway, you don't have to have a lot of money. It's for everybody. It's a melting pot. People don't want to go there and look like they're wealthy. They go there, they're dressed down and look like they're part of the crowd, and that's good. It's good. What more can I say? I can't think of too much more to say. You probably wouldn't listen anyhow. But, anyway, you got the point. It's a good place just to simply go to hang out. You want to turn it into another parking lot, so be it. Let the people decide that. This body, by doing this, isn't really doing anything. We're not doing anything. We're just putting it before the people, that's all. We're spending all this time here on this issue. In my opinion,...
