city's general fund. It could be if a wealthy individual, such as yourself, wanted to make a contribution to the city, that would then go to...then the city would donate to the fair. It could be from anywhere. But I will tell you this. If a wealthy individual, such as yourself, donated it directly to the fair, that would not count towards the city's contribution. (Laugh)

SENATOR LOUDEN: Okay. Thank you. I see you're distracted, so that answers some of my questions. But, anyway, I think we have to be very careful when we draft these amendments and put it into the constitution. You're leaving this thing wide open that whatever money they can find, wherever they want to find it or whatever they want to do, they can use it to acquire these matching funds. That's fine. If that's the way you want the bill written and that's the way you want to vote on it, why, I guess that's it. Myself, I would rather see some...a little bit narrower guidelines, I think, on how they...what monies they were supposed to use before we throw it wide open to them for any dollar they have. There's a lot of these cities have their keno funds and that sort of thing, and they would probably use it at one particular time to receive their matching funds, and then the rest of the time they could use something else. And I don't know if that's the proper way to go about it or not. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Louden. Senator Bourne. Senator Bourne waives. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, Senator Landis chooses his words carefully and he said he supports Senator Bourne's amendment as drafted. I'm going to offer an amendment to make sure that no state funds wind up going for this purpose. I don't trust the city of Lincoln, I don't trust the Legislature, and I don't want to underestimate "Emperor" Radcliffe. Now, I'm telling you, if the "Emperor" can get you all to take an asinine proposal like this and put it in the constitution, you think he couldn't get you to appropriate enough money to meet the city's matching obligation? We bailed out Richardson County. We gave them money. We appropriated money to them. Money can be appropriated by the state to the city of Lincoln. Now, if my amendment is rejected, then I'm not going to accept all this
