to change in time. No. Here's how it works. Residency and how you declare your residency is one of the most subtle things in the law. Your neighbor who lives next to you, the rancher who has the great big spread next to yours, all they have...they continue to live in their Nebraska house, they continue to drive their Nebraska car with a Nebraska driver's license. And they don't surrender their Nebraska driver's license. But they have a house--and I'll be distributing an article. This isn't exactly hidden from view. They're publishing articles called "Florida or bust." I'll distribute it when I'm done talking. But you see, they buy a condominium in Florida. They register to vote in Florida. They don't unregister to vote in Nebraska, but they register to vote in Florida. They have a Florida car and a Florida driver's license. It's...their car is licensed in Florida. They register to vote in Florida. They don't unregister to vote in Nebraska. They get their Social Security check at their address in Florida. They have all their bills sent to Florida. Somebody takes care of them there. Or forwards them to Nebraska. They make certain that they stay in and around Florida and "in and around Florida" can mean you depart for your 30-day cruise from Florida. So you fly from Nebraska to Florida, you depart for 30 days, you come back to Florida. That 30 days counts as having been in Florida. So you're in and around Florida, or Arizona, take your pick, for more than six months. Your neighbors notice that you're gone a lot, just like you always were, because you're enjoying the change of climate and scenery and not having to put up the winter. You can do this in South Dakota too, but there are some built-in natural disadvantages. (Laugh) It's too cold in the winter and it's too hot in the summer. Oh, by the way, you can have your last illness in Nebraska, you can die in a hospital bed in Nebraska, you can be buried from a Nebraska church or synagogue, your children can be married and wed at your church or synagogue in Nebraska, you can be buried in Nebraska, but lo and behold, you will have met all the legal tests for being a Florida or Arizona or South Dakota resident when they get around to charging...doing your estate tax return. You will have qualified. And there won't be a lawsuit, and there won't be a big hullabaloo, and you won't have known it went on. This is all private contractual matters. This is privacy, contract, residence tax, and we just don't collect the money. Now, in a
