which was done. Now when the Judiciary Committee deals with these kind of matters, we take time on them. We listen to the testimony, work is done by staff on proposed amendments, and Senator Brashear and I will look at them and if it's a bill of a member of the committee, that person is shown the amendment and has the opportunity to work on it any way that he or she feels is necessary to meet his or her approval. So this is not something that was just thrown together on the floor at the last minute, as happens with some of my colleagues' bills that they get upset about when I challenge them. So this is not my bill. I did not introduce it, I'm not a cosponsor, and I don't like what the bill is doing. I don't like these databases, so it will just be a matter of whether the amendment gets adopted or not. But if it is not adopted, then I'm going to oppose the bill, and I don't think that will come as a surprise to Senator Johnson because I had told him I did not like what his bill does. Senator Brashear is aware that this is not the kind of bill that I agree with. But if this amendment had been retained, I would not have opposed the bill. But if the amendment is not added to the bill, then it's in the form that it was when I was opposed to it, and I will just continue to oppose...well, I will begin to oppose it. Senator Brown says this bill says "any body fluid." It does not say that. It does say any body fluid can be used. If you look in line three of page 1, it says, "as a result of a body fluid test." When you get down to line 22, it talks about, "If this report concludes that initial body fluids were not those of the person..." When you're drafting legislation in Nebraska now, they will not use the either/or construction. The statute will not say the body fluid or fluids. The plural will be used because that is inclusive of the singular, so line 22 could have said the report concludes that the initial body fluid or fluids, but that is not the construction. This language does not say any body fluid. When initial DNA testing came into vogue, the tests were not as sophisticated. You needed more material to conduct tests. Now they have ways to generate more of the same material and it will have the identical genetic makeup obviously. So they can get...
