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individuals were endorsed by this particular right-to-life group because they didn't march in lockstep with the director of the group. I have another article that was distributed out on the floor earlier about the director of this right-to-life group who actually avoided a felony charge by agreeing to some sort of a court diversion program, and I think there's a disconnect. Two of our colleagues, who are excellent, decent, caring pro-life individuals, are being judged by someone who is all but a felon. I am very disturbed by that. I am a Catholic. I am a pro-life individual, but I also have said that I'm a common sense individual. What's going on here makes no sense to me. I see a lobbying endeavor that intimidates. If you don't agree with me 100 percent, I'm going to show you and you're not going to get an endorsement. Quite frankly, I'm disappointed that both of our colleagues even sent in the survey because, in a sense, they legitimize this far-right, outrageous entity that mandates you march in lockstep or we won't help you. I can't even believe that. For one of our colleagues to actually take pregnant teens in their home, if there isn't a pro-life individual such as that, nobody exists. And then for him to make a decision on one issue and be denied that, and then we're going to let these pro-life individuals, this radical...this particular radical group, further an agenda because we're reluctant to not march in lockstep with them? I'm disturbed by that. I don't know what my political career is going to...what turn it's going to take and, quite frankly, I don't care. If this hurts me, I don't care. But here's what I'm going to do. So long as the felon is the director of a right-to-life group, I'll not be supporting any of the bills that that group is supporting, so long as I'm in the Legislature. If that costs me politically, so be it, but somebody needs to step up and say this is the right thing to do, and that's what I'm going to do. So I'm serving notice now that, so long as that radical agenda is pursued by someone who shouldn't even be in the same room as our colleagues because of her felony, I won't be voting for any legislation that that group is supporting. I'm just serving notice now. If none of...if you aren't disturbed by what's transpired here, you're not paying attention. This is outrageous.
