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unaware of what gambling is? And I'm going to tie all this in, because I get another chance to speak, I believe. Don't I, Mr. President? Thank you.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Brown.

SENATOR BROWN: Mr. President, members, I haven't spoken on this bill and I haven't spoken on this bill because, frankly, I'm conflicted by it. Senator Smith is correct. There are...there is agreement that a change needs to be made, and I'm conflicted because I believe that the information that we have been providing presumes a certain decision that I'm not certain should be...that should be our policy to presume. Even though I believe in an individual's right to make that decision, I don't presume that we...that we encourage or provide information that's exclusive about a certain decision, and I almost think that that's what...what we have done with the information that we provide about the judicial bypass. But my concern about this and what caused me to stand up, finally, is that, once again, we are presented with something and told, you know, you either do it or you don't. That's not the way we're supposed to be doing business. We're supposed to be arriving at the best answer. The best answer very, very probably is not providing information exclusively about the judicial bypass, because that presumes a certain decision that may not have been made. We should be providing information for young women about people, like the Speaker, who might be able to give them assistance. But we couldn't ever get there. We couldn't ever get to that kind of a discussion about what young people need in terms of information, not about how they get around telling their parents what they...the situation they may be in and going forward with a decision that may or may not be good for them, but how we provide information about how they deal better with life situations that aren't...that aren't good. And we didn't have the opportunity because we are sometimes constrained in this process. If we have 33 votes, that's the magic number, then we just kind of ram it through and we don't have the hard discussions that get us to good policy. And the...when we do argue things out I think we come to a better decision, and I wish we were doing that more. And I really have come to believe, and it was a very hard decision for me, because for the
