not be requiring public school teachers to be the agents of somebody's social agenda. That's not their role. I think more of the public school teachers than to put them into that kind of a position. Senator Crosby...Senator Schimek, excuse me, mentioned that Senator Crosby was reasonable. She was willing to work things out. Well, the record shows that Senator Crosby voted yes on Ron Withem's bill, the very same bill that's on the floor today. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Foley. (Visitors introduced.) On with discussion of the motion to return. Senator Combs.

SENATOR COMBS: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the body, I haven't spoken out on this bill as far as being officially on the record. And I do listen, and what's important to me, and I'm glad to hear some of it on the floor this morning, is perhaps what I like to call the third side of an issue. You know, we try...we...sometimes we divide an issue into two sides and we stand on one or the other, but I think that when we're standing there we have to constantly have a vision beyond those two positions to what I call Truth with a capital T. And that means, regardless of these glasses that I have on, the glasses Senator Chambers has on, Senator Smith or anyone else in here, that truth exists regardless of what set of lenses we have on to look at it. And that's what I really have respected and really admired this morning in what has taken place on the floor, is just some honest evaluation of some truth. Frankly, I was extremely disappointed when I heard on KFAB that Senator Bromm was not receiving the endorsement, because I did...I just have to echo what Senator Bourne had said earlier today. I think that that's rather unfortunate to lump all those issues into one pot, but that's, again, what...that's what lobbying and having political action groups is all about. So if, perhaps, if they want to start a new PAC that is right-to-life for abortion and other issues, and then these other issues on a different plane perhaps, maybe we need a new PAC, you know? Let's think outside the box here. And it's easy to vilify people who don't agree with us, but I think no matter what side we're on, we've got to keep looking at that third side, Truth with a capital T, and agree that we may never get there totally, but always be willing
