SENATOR BYARS: Madam President, no, I think this was adequately explained on Select File. And as I said, Senator Bourn is okay with the distribution of the dollars. And it's a positive in these negative times for the state of Nebraska to be able to bring dollars back, and at the same time do some very positive things for people with developmental disabilities and mental retardation. So I would yield the balance of my time back to the Chair.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senators Byars and Erdman. Senator Landis, you are recognized to speak on the motion to return to Select File for a specific amendment.

SENATOR LANDIS: I only put my light on to say that the Senator Erdman piece is work that we did in the committee, and I approve of that, and we reported that idea out unanimously, and that the Byars piece of this amendment is simply in furtherance of an idea that, in fact, we did have a hearing on and supported, put out unanimously, was adopted on Select File, and this is the administrative carrying out of that idea to its logical conclusion. I'm going to support this amendment.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: I would like to ask a few questions of Senator Byars, please.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Byars, would you yield to a few questions?

SENATOR BYARS: I certainly would, Madam President.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: As you know, dollars are pretty interesting to us at this moment. Can you just explain the way in which this would work as far as fiscal impact upon the state, and particularly, if any, on the General Funds of the state?

SENATOR BYARS: Yes, I certainly can, Senator. What we do is impose a 6 percent provider tax that would provide revenue from the private providers of \$1,020,000 that's done on their...the
