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this amendment that we're discussing now says a certified copy of the birth certificate and one other form of proof of ID, and then those are described in 60-484. Now there is language down here on line 17 through 20 that says the applicant may be...well, there is some language that says in lieu of a certified copy of a birth certificate, the applicant shall furnish two other reliable forms of documentation. I need to go back and read through what we adopted because I'm fairly confident then, on either General or Select File, we eliminated the multiple forms of ID requirement, and I think that this might be a little more than a technical amendment. Actually, would Senator Baker, yield to a question again?

SENATOR CUDABACK: PRESIDING

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Baker, would you...

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, I would.

SENATOR BOURNE: And I know that we can have this discussion once your motion to return to Select File has been adopted or voted on, but I'm not sure that I'm going to support the motion to return to Select at this point. Was this amendment brought to you by...or did you draft this, or what's the genesis?

SENATOR BAKER: This was brought back to...brought to us by the Department of Motor Vehicles. This was...I did not...we did not prepare this amendment.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay.

SENATOR BAKER: What we were trying to do is harmonize some things. We have basically two sections of the bill. That's just a very rough description. We have, in the first part of the bill, driver's licenses and we had included ID cards. We've stricken that on page 6, line 9, and moved that back to Section...I think it's on page 33 is where we move that, trying to clarify some things. We've always required the Social Security number, and...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.
