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restrictions we put up, we've been doing it administratively with the Social Security check right now; if we do more of this double identity cards to get a license, I think that we're going to have a situation where we're going to have less safety on the roads, less people identified. We're going to have more and more people that are here working, whether they're legal or not, they should be legal on our roads, as we look at them from a state level. We're not the Immigration Service. It's not our place to be the Immigration Service as a state. That's a federal responsibility. What we need to do is protect our citizens. We need to protect the driving public, we need to make sure that people are more likely to stop when they are violating the law and a law enforcement officer stops them. We need to have people that are obeying the laws as much as possible. And we ought to look at ways that we can get more people legal to do that, and have a driver's license and get to work and be safe on our roads. And that has to be our number one priority, I think. Being an Immigration Service is not our charge. Our charge is just...is public safety. And with, I'm worried that if we put more roadblocks into people getting a driver's license, then we're going to have less safe roads.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Connealy. Senator Baker, on your motion to return.

SENATOR BAKER: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. I'm trying to get back up speed on this. I apologize for not being up to speed, I guess, on it, but we require two forms for IDs and one of those...the two forms are birth certificate and there's, like, Senator Bourne mentioned, there are other instruments proof of identify other than a birth certificate, if they cannot find those. But the reason we were so tough on birth certificates is because of simply kidnapping issues and people claiming, I guess, infants as their children when they were not. What we did, they changed the form for the license...or to one form of ID for a license, and what we're doing with this amendment clarifies that if you're under 18, an individual must provide a birth certificate as part of that requirement. So I'm going to go back and review the amendments. Senator Bourne, this, like you said, this has been discussed, rediscussed, hashed over, amended, and so on, and it's not an easy bill to understand, I
