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SENATOR BAKER: What?

SENATOR CUDABACK: I said time.

SENATOR BAKER: That was my time?

SENATOR CUDABACK: I guess we have...I'm sorry. You have two minutes left, Senator Baker.

SENATOR BAKER: Okay. I thought so. Thank you. I think we need to maintain the requirement of two forms of ID to obtain an initial ID card, state ID card. I think that's good policy. And a lot of it is done to protect the young people and make sure that they do have a proper birth certificate, and we do have allowances within the bill if they cannot provide a valid birth certificate. There are alternatives to that that the state will accept. So I am opposed to making state ID cards that easy to get, I guess, the pure and simple of it. One form of ID, I don't think is adequate to get an initial identification card in the state of Nebraska. We did change it on driver's licenses. We did not change it in the entire yellow copy of the bill. It's still two forms that's been in the statutes, that's been the policy of the state. It's in statute. I think we ought to maintain that and I would ask for your support to return the bill to Select File. Thank you, Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Baker. I'm sorry about the error on my part. Senator Johnson.

SENATOR JOHNSON: Mr. President, members of the body, Senator Baker, if I could ask a question or two of you?
