SENATOR BAKER: Okay. Thank you, Senator Johnson, for the time. I think another issue that we need to bring up that we haven't yet is these are not Department of Motor Vehicles employees that are issuing these driver's licenses and ID cards. These are county officials, in most cases nonelected, that are in county treasurer's office, and I think that's another reason we need that dual safeguard of two forms of ID. Quite honestly, I don't know how well trained some of the counties, say the deputy treasurers and people are. They're probably very competent and well trained, but we have to remember that they probably aren't...haven't taken a class, I would guess, maybe the deputy and some of the assistants, as far as recognizing IDs and cards. And if we require two forms, I think that's probably...and that's what we've been requiring. We've been requiring two forms, and Senator Bourne is proposing to go back...or go to one form. We've been requiring two forms, I think that's a safeguard, in that I have no fault of the county treasurers nor their assistants, but I think that's a policy we should maintain as a safeguard for identity theft. I really do. I think we should remain at two forms of ID and, in order to do that...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BAKER: ...and harmonize the sections, the various sections in this bill, we need to adopt the amendment I'm proposing. I have to reiterate that this ID cards, driver's licenses, are complicated sections of the state statutes. I hope people have gotten a better grasp of what it is we go through to try and provide a good form of ID that's acceptable across the country as a legitimate ID. When you get an ID card from the state of Nebraska, it is a good card, it's not something that was obtained by using a, say, one false document to get it, and thereby make it credible. So with that, I would return what time I have left to the Chair. Thank you.
