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SENATOR BAKER: We voted for that one form with the understanding, I had, of applying to driver's licenses. We did not change it in the bill on page 32.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That is the policy for these identification cards. With the bill as it is...as it stands right now, how many forms of identification are required to get one of these cards?

SENATOR BAKER: I would think it's the tougher burden of proof. It would be two forms on page 32...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What does it say?

SENATOR BAKER: It says, and this is Chapter 60-4,181. This is sub...well, I'd read you the whole thing: Sub (1) A state identification card shall be issued by the county treasurer after the person requesting the card (a) files an application or examiner's certificate with an examining officer; (b) furnishes two form or proof of identification in Section 60-484; and (c) pays the fee.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, let me ask you this, Senator. When two...if there are two provisions of statute, the one most recently enacted, if there's a conflict, is the one that prevails. Isn't that true?

SENATOR BAKER: I would think so.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And the one we will most recently enact is the one requiring one piece of identification, as we've done already by our vote on General File. Isn't that true, if the bill stays as it is?

SENATOR BAKER: I believe that to be true, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'd like to ask Senator Bourne a question because he seemed a little testy today and I need company because I'm testy.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bourne.
