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particular entity that is looking to that type of renovation or that type of new construction can show that that builder just can't do it at that particular moment, because it's not economically justified at that particular moment, that's what I was focusing on. But my guess would be that you'd be correct, too. I mean if somebody said, look, let's look five years down the road, I mean...I guess what I'm saying is I think that...I know...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, let's take a classic situation, Senator. I mean any builder is going to be able to come in and say front end this is going to cost more. That's what's going to be the case in almost all of these instances. There is a slightly...a slight to significant greater cost in meeting these standards, my guess would be. Now just because the cost is slightly to significantly higher, does that in and of itself become economic justification for using this exception?

SENATOR FRIEND: My answer would be no and I'll tell you why...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR FRIEND: ...because on the first...to answer your first piece of it, I don't know that your contention is necessarily true. I mean I don't think we're going to run into that many situations based on the study that I've done where you are talking about average jurisdiction saying, look, I can't meet this. The point made earlier is that a lot of these jurisdictions are already doing it. It's just that they have difficulty. The process and procedure, or the system, looks different than what the 2003 IECC enables. So that's the first piece. The second piece is that's not what economically justified means to me. Economically justified means that we're talking about making it extremely difficult for this particular business entity, this builder of this community to enhance and add to the economic development of that particular jurisdiction. That's what economically feasible means to me. It's not at \$500 a house, Senator. So I mean I think I understand what you're saying. You're talking about if we want economic development to continue and we look five years down the road, is this something that this particular entity would have to communicate to the
