what more I can say about this. I think the final thing that I'd like to point out is that we're looking for...we are looking for uniformity. Senator Beutler brought up some good questions, and I believe that with all the parties that I've discussed this with over the last five months, we're going to achieve that. There is permissive language in it, but the fact of the matter is I think that we're moving in a direction that's good for this state. So I would ask for the advancement of LB 888. Thank you.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. If nothing else on the bill, Senator Mossey.

SENATOR MOSSEY: Mr. President, I move advancement of LB 888 to E & R for engrossing.

SENATOR HARTNETT: You heard the motion. All in favor say aye. Opposed nay. (Advanced, Legislative Journal page 1333.) Next bill is LB 868.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 868. Senator Mossey, I do have Enrollment and Review amendments, first of all. (AM7187, Legislative Journal page 1039.)
