negligence, because you're starting to implicate intent and knowledge of what you're doing when you get to willful and wanton. The only thing absent would be malice or the...what you might call the evil intent to cause the harm. But you can know that harm will result and you could still willfully place the act and the harm does, in fact, result. But since you cannot prove malice, perhaps, there still is no liability.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Let me go beyond what I was asking you now. If a person uses an unsterilized needle and the child came down with AIDS, an unsterilized needle usage, if the person doesn't know it's not sterilized, is not willful and wanton, necessarily. But due care would require the person to sterilize the needle, but the failure to sterilize is simple negligence and there'd be no liability if a child were infected with AIDS. No liability; there is immunity. I don't think that is a good standard. I got my light on so I won't ask you to answer that because it would be unfair in the short time that I have remaining. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: It's your third time now, Senator Chambers. You may continue.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'm going to have to offer an amendment so that I can continue, and if you're going to adopt what Senator Raikes is offering you, I think I should offer an amendment. So I'd taken one up to the desk, but it would not attach to the amendment as drafted, so let me look and see if maybe it still would. Aha, I can still use it because there is only a phrase change on the front page, so page 2 remains the same, and by altering the number of the amendment, it will apply to the new one. So I'm going to have it placed on the desk and continue my discussion without asking questions, because I'll have an opportunity when my amendment is considered. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, as a member of the Judiciary Committee, I see all kinds of bills related to liability and attempts by people to obtain immunity from liability for their misconduct. I am not sympathetic to such things as that. We
