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credentialed under the uniform licensing law to practice as a physician and some other things, then they shall be immune from civil liability for any act or omission resulting in damage or injury unless such damage or injury was caused by the willful or wanton act or omission of such practitioner. So you can correct me, but I think that basically means that if you...if a child went to...or anyone else went to a free clinic for treatment, this is the standard that would apply. One other comment before I let you respond is, you know, the standard here I think is important. The notion is that you have kids in school suffering from these asthmatic attacks or other such conditions where the likelihood is, without some sort of emergency treatment, they may well die. So do you want to impose a standard, and I would seriously like your answer to this, do you want to impose a standard which may simply result in most nonmedical personnel, teachers, saying, no, thank you; if I am subject to this kind of liability then I will refuse the training? And it may well be that there is not someone on the floor to administer the training and/or...I mean, to add to that, suppose the standard were such that, as you mentioned, if a person went ahead with this procedure without washing their hands. Well, suppose I'm on third floor and the nearest place I can wash my hands is first floor. So I see the student down. I jot down the stairs and wash up and head back up and do whatever I need to do, and it may well be that enough time has lapsed that the situation is beyond recovery. So, again, please respond, and if you have different words or a different standard, and if it's possible to explain it to me, I'd like to try to hear that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Raikes, that is the dilemma--what is to be done? With the...in the statute that was handed to me, they're talking about a volunteer in a free clinic and that there is immunity if the clinic is operated by a licensed hospital. It's in a medical environment. The person is credentialed and the standard is going to be such that that person knows very well what he or she is required to do. And I believe that the hospital, which is operating this facility, could be held liable if it's in agreement that the clinic is a part of its operation.

SENATOR RAIKES: So, if I can interrupt you.
