Redfield, could I ask you a question?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you respond, Senator Redfield?

SENATOR HARTNETT: Senator Redfield, and you probably have already said it, but what you did is you took what the Governor had proposed to the Appropriations Committee. Is that correct?

SENATOR REDFIELD: Where the Appropriations Committee chose not to go with the Governor's number, I did change it, except in those programs that we have other bills pending, such as TEEOSA and public assistance, et cetera.

SENATOR HARTNETT: So otherwise, besides those, it's the...it is the same. Okay. Okay, that's...I appreciate the (inaudible). Senator Wehrbein, can I ask you a question?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Wehrbein, would you yield?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Senator Redfield is...I think the Governor's cuts were mostly just kind of across the board. Maybe I should have asked this of Senator Redfield. Did...what is the...what's the amount of money that the Appropriations Committee cuts versus the Governor's cuts? More, less, about the same, et cetera? And you can answer that and then have the rest of my time.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: As I recall, Senator Hartnett, the original Governor's budget was cut \$10 million. It was a \$10 million cut, somewhere in that area.

SENATOR HARTNETT: And your cut?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: A little over ten.

SENATOR HARTNETT: What's your cut in your...in Appropriations?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Four...four point something.
