SENATOR HARTNETT: So there's \$6 million difference? Is that...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yeah, ours is between four and five, and I think Senator Redfield would approximate taking it back to the ten, although it's done differently than the Governor did it.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay. Well, if you want the rest of my time, you can. You said you wanted some time, Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yeah, I...thank you. I would, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You may.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: It's a little hard to explain because it's complex. Some of what Senator Redfield has done is gone back to the original Governor's bill. And I was looking for some notes and I can't find them, some I made, but we had...there's typically, from January, when their budget is presented, till now, and I've got some amendments coming up here and on other bills in response to things that are coming along, but there's...I was trying to remember, I think it's about \$8 million has come in for requests for expenditures that we felt we had to do, for example, in our...in our budget that the Governor did not do. And I cannot find the notes. I had it scratched. I usually...I got in the habit in recent years of keeping on a separate little piece of paper of just those additional requests we have for money that are very common. It might change in the match. It may be additional money. We put some additional money, by the way, in Department of Education to do the assessment. We felt that was critical. The Governor had taken that money out. Now, I know Senator Redfield doesn't touch that at this case. But what we had tried hard to do in this was, by...through the use of cash transfers, through the use of the federal money, and some delays using cash from the lottery fund which we found or some others to avoid taking any extensive cuts this next year. And as I said originally, we had not intended to take any cuts as of...previous to February 27, but that did change. But we worked hard not to further hurt most agencies, not all, because when you do a half a percent you...anything across the board, it doesn't come across uniformly. And I know Senator Redfield tried to exclude some
