in the out two years. But we say we can't possibly cut \$300 million out this year in order to get there.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay. Senator Wehrbein, and I'll be honest with you, I did not review the Governor's recommendations when he put those recommendations out at the beginning of the session.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time. Senator Wehrbein, followed by Senator Redfield, Cunningham, Smith, and others.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay. Did you say me, Mr. President?

SENATOR CUDABACK: I did, Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Since I'm going to...I was going to go down the list a little more, but I will pick up on what Senator Bourne asked. If you also notice in line 29, the \$1.00, \$1.10, if we had passed the \$1.10, Senator Bourne, that number would have shown up there at \$52 million each year, or \$104 million, which would have reduced \$296 million by \$104 million, would bring that to \$192 million. And if we have \$175 million minimum reserve requirement, 175 to 192 is what, 15? No. Yeah. We'd be about \$15 million short; 75 to 92, yeah...or \$17 million short. So those two factors alone would have brought us up to within...and then you'd have to add the minimum reserve back into that. But I'm just saying we...that was one way of...what \$1.10 would have done because it would have reduced our expenses. And so...I was just telling you. If you have a question, I'll answer, but I'm going to go...I'm going to go on down the list here a minute. I was at the Secretary of State. I explained that. Now the State Auditor, that is kind of a sore spot. We've...the Auditor was cut back severely, if you all recall, a few years ago. Mrs. Witek is trying hard to bring that agency back and has done a fairly successful job. We had to increase her budget quite a bit two years ago in order to give her enough auditors. She is still stretched very thin and is having difficulty getting all the work done that she is required to do because she's short of auditors. And frankly, she came in and begged for more auditors, and we did not do it. But this will take the equivalent of an auditor, well, probably
