Committee, it had some problems. This is looking at it on the front end, on the front end, reminding members that those that are in our Work Ethic Camp are on probation. They're on intensive supervision probation. The Work Ethic Camp is a program within the intensive supervision program. What I'm saying is, again thinking structurally, thinking outside of the box, we can do this cheaper if we keep these offenders in the communities, eating their own meals, again paying their child support, supporting their families, under this intense supervision. And with this amendment, we will be able to hire 20 additional officers and service 500 offenders under the intensive supervision probation program. If this is successful and if we can target these offenders that may have been those that were going to go to the penitentiary, we may be coming back here next year and talking intelligently about closing one of our correctional centers. I mean, it could be done if we do things a different way, if we make structural changes, and that's a discussion I'm trying to spur with AM3400. With that, Mr. Clerk, I do believe I have an amendment to my amendment, if I may.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Synowiecki would move to amend his amendment. (FA1643, Legislative Journal page 1378.)

SENATOR HARTNETT: Senator Synowiecki, would you open?

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. This...we just had the wrong program number for the parole. The 250...these earmarks, these one-time earmarks, \$250,000 to the Probation Community Corrections Fund and the Parole Corrections Fund...Community Corrections Fund is a one-time expenditure of \$250,000, to kind of jump-start them programs. And the amendment to my amendment, FA1643, simply changes that program number on line 11 from 200 to Program Number 367, in terms of the Parole Enhancement Fund for Community Corrections. Thank you, Senator Hartnett.
