them to fit back into society. So I think that it would be premature for us to determine that we could just turn over the same thing to a probation system. I do believe that we need to look into the entire correctional system and see if we are accomplishing what we would like to accomplish. But I think, from what I have seen with the Work Ethic Camp, that they are attempting to change the lives of these people, and we don't do a very good job of that with ordinary correction facilities. We just incarcerate them, let them out and say, now, associate with good people and they don't know very many. So when they go out into their life after that, they have trouble adapting themselves into society. These young people are actually physically working. They're doing things in a general good system. They're doing road work. They're doing...when I was in North Platte this summer, they were out there helping to renovate the Wild West Barn, the Buffalo Bill Barn, and these kids had never learned how to work. They'd never learned how to get up in the morning. They'd never learned how to just adapt themselves to society. This gives them an opportunity to do that. I do believe that we need to look into this. I was in favor of Senator Synowiecki's proposal of...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: ...melding the probation and the parole system. I think we can do a lot of these things more efficiently, but I think it's premature for us to determine that, on this legislative floor, what we should do is take a preemptive position and to close a segment of our correctional system. I think it's just in the realm of getting going. I think it's making good progress, and I would urge that we reject the amendments proposed by Senator Synowiecki. Thank you.
