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months every person that is at the Work Ethic Camp will be back at home under the supervision of an intensive supervision probation officer.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, so...

SENATOR SNOWIECKI: So it doesn't have the same ramifications that LCC closing did.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yeah, well, thank you. I'm going to oppose this and I want to be sure that this wasn't a bill because I don't want to do anything as drastic as this is, considering the time and effort we've put into this, to close the Work Ethic Camp. But beyond that, I have...I guess I must misunderstand because I have been told by, I thought, judges that if either you go to prison or you go to the Work Ethic Camp. And if that...if Work Ethic Camp is part of intensive probation, then I also have some questions of Senator...and I'm going to make a comment. Then I have some more questions for you, Senator Snowiecki. But I want to see...I'm going to think out loud here. If intensive probation is...Work Ethic Camp is considered part of intensive probation, then I have misunderstood that, because I didn't think intensive probation, as we would think of it, as part of that. I thought it was either Work Ethic Camp or prison. But beyond that, I'd like to ask some questions, as you stand. Part of the reason there's some expense out there, at the Work Ethic Camp, is because of Senator Pedersen's insistence. We put education. We put in, I call it, a form of mentoring. We had discipline in there. If they're on intensive probation, say I'm wrong and you're right, and I don't have any reason to believe that you're not right, but if you go in intensive probation, do they get the same kind of mentoring and treatment that they would at the Work Ethic Camp? That is, do they have to get up in the morning, do they have to go to a job, do they have to go to drug education? Do they have to go to drug treatment? Many of the things that I understand that happens out at the Work Ethic Camp, I didn't think, in my limited understanding, that that was part of an intensive probation. Senator Snowiecki, that's a question.

SENATOR SNOWIECKI: The only difference, Senator, is you do it
