SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you respond, Senator?

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Yes, sure.

SENATOR BAKER: I've been conversing with staff and people behind the glass. I take it this was not a bill, is that correct?

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: No.

SENATOR BAKER: And when was the amendment filed?

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: It was filed today.

SENATOR BAKER: Okay. So...and I'm echoing...thank you, Senator Synowiecki. I'm echoing Senator Schimek's concerns here. This thing obviously came out of the woodwork today. I don't know what time today it was, but some time today; obviously no hearing, no process. And we're quibbling about facts and figures here that seem to be going in opposite directions. Corrections is telling me one thing; you're saying something else. I do know from my personal experience that these people out there are not eligible to be what you consider typically ISP candidates. If they do not agree to go to the Work Ethic Camp and then, granted, they're on ISP, if they don't agree to going to the Work Ethic Camp, then they're sentenced to time in prison, with the exception of that group you mentioned, I don't remember how many in 1,851. There were some people that did go on just standard probation, not ISP. They obviously did not commit a serious enough offense to go to either ISP, and Work Ethic Camp as a condition of ISP, or behind the walls. So there's all sorts of interpretation of these figures out there and the average person has no background or basic knowledge to make a decision at this late hour with an amendment that was filed today. And I want to be sure that people understand that if we don't...if these people don't agree as a condition of the ISP to participate in the Work Ethic Camp, there are the vast majority of them go to prison, and the cost then, it just triples.
