get over the fact that Nebraska is perfectly willing and, on occasion, has had high-level nuclear waste dumps. We still have one 20 miles southwest of Lincoln. We had nuclear missiles, which certainly were more dangerous than any kind of dump that you can come up with, almost within sight of where we are sitting right now, and they were okay. But we couldn't find a place for the low-level sort of things that every hospital that does any kind of significant procedures produce every day. We actually could look at all of our hospitals as being low-level nuclear waste dumps, but we couldn't find a place, a common site, for all of these. What I was thinking of as we were sitting here is this. Maybe what we have is a fine for the voters of the state of Nebraska for not coming up with a solution these past many years. If you're going down the highway and you get pulled over for speeding or whatever, they don't ask you whether you make \$1 million a year or whether you make \$12,000 a year; the fine is the fine. Maybe this is...should be looked at as a voter fine, and I don't say that, that we should think of penalizing one party here for making the decision. I think you can certainly make a case that the other party officials involved here haven't solved the problem once it showed up. But the fact of the matter is that the responsibility still goes back if we're going to say government by the people. So I don't know as we ought to be fined in this case and then ask just certain groups of people to pay the fine. Maybe those that voted or those that didn't vote should bear equal responsibility. One of the things...(laugh) I wrote down here, no, I'm not suggesting that we go back to a poll tax, by the way. But the...it seems to me that we have to be very cautious in this state where we increase the tax. I remember Senator Landis, and I think I'm quoting him right, is he said that we are a relatively high-tax state across the board, but the one place where we have to watch what we're doing is on the income tax, and that if we tax those...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR JOHNSON: ...at the top, and that's what we have a tendency to do and I don't think Senator Hartnett has that in his bill, tendency is to those people can afford it, but I remember what Senator Landis said. Those are the decision
