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SENATOR SCHIMEK: Oh, yeah, I see that.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The surcharge is for a three-year period.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Total of \$21 million over any three-year period. But then at the end it says, the Legislature may provide for transfer to the General Fund of any money in the Low-Level Radioactive Waste Disposal Litigation Fund no longer needed for the purposes. So if we...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Right.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...collected enough money, paid it in time, there were money left over, that's when we would see that it went into the General Fund.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Right.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay. Well, I'm still not inclined to this as the answer to the fund raising problem. I think it will be...I think there will be...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...some problems in implementing it and processing it. But it does sound better to me than it did at first blush. And I would not be as horrified, I guess, as I originally would have been if this does pass. I still think that the income tax would be the one that would address...that would encourage that. We get the people who can most afford it to address the problem. And that would be...still be my preference. And I will just...I will listen more to the discussion, and hope that we can find a way to address this potential shortfall. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Engel, on the Beutler amendment to LB 1090.

SENATOR ENGEL: Mr. President, members of the body, I'd like to ask Senator Beutler a question. I'm sorry, I didn't hear exactly how much revenue this would bring in each...
