SENATOR BRASHEAR: That is also true.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then you're familiar, I presume, with the "Holly Bibble" in toto and certainly with the New Testament. Is that true or false?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: I would never claim...I'm familiar, yes. I would never claim to have a comprehensive total understanding...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...of scripture.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You've read the verse, I'm sure, judge ye not.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Yes, lest ye be judged. Yes, I have.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What do you propose to do with judge ye not in view of the fact that you have a Judgment Fund? Thank you, Senator Brashear. That's all I would ask you. Members of the Legislature, I'm just having a little fun this afternoon because, once again, the cobra will waste no venom. They've been talking about the number of votes needed. I heard 25, like an auction, somebody else said 30 but not now; I offer 33. If we don't get an income tax, 33 votes is what we're looking at. Thank you, Mr. President.
