responsibility away from us. It's an easy way out for us. And I heard several say, it's the least painless or it's the most...well, why is it? Because you don't have to bite the bullet to raise the taxes or if that's what we need to do is cut more spending. I'd like to also just talk briefly, I thought about this too late, but I should have...I can do an interim study within the Fiscal Office, and I'm going to alert the Fiscal Office what I'm thinking. I think we need to look out under our present trends, and that we're talking about the structure. Senator Bourne, you talked about that. We aren't too far off on our structure right now, but we're going to get worse as we watch Medicaid go up, as we watch health insurance costs. I'm going to, over the interim, this summer, and next winter I'll be back with what kind of projections will...what will our budget look like in 2012, just 8 years away, with the present trends that we're seeing? Senator Brown brought that to my attention with the pie chart she showed what's happened just in the last few years, and I guarantee you what you're going to see is education at the...higher education is going to be less of a part of our demands and we are going to see a huge increase, the baby boomers are going to hit, we're going to have long-term nursing home care. By 2012, it's going to scare the socks off of you. And I don't think, in contrast to what's some being said here, we haven't done much about our structure, we have looked at our budget very carefully in most cases. And it's my considered opinion that we can't...we're going to have to change as a society or as a state our attitude towards what we're going to have to want...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...to do and we just can't avoid the taxing. If we're going to take care of the elderly, if we're going to take care of the needy, if we're going to provide the type of education we think our kids should have, both K-12 and higher ed, that's three-fourths of our budget I just talked about right now, three-fourths of our budget, and we can't balance three-fourths of our budget on one-fourth of the rest of it, the operating. So there is going to have to be some changes and I don't know what they are. Even if I knew, no one would believe it today. But we talk about structure, that is a huge issue,
