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and I don't agree with the idea that we're not doing something. We have some responsibilities of state government. That's that 25 percent or less of our budget and we have another 25 percent for health and so forth. And education is growing and I don't know how you're going to cut back on education when it's more vital than it's ever been. So I...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...oppose what Senator Brashear is...because I don't think we can...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Sen...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...afford to saddle our future with another \$28 million.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. President and members of the body. Senator Brashear, could I ask you some questions? What you're proposing, I'm looking at the last page of your handout here, you're proposing to issue this year \$155 million bonds, correct?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: That's correct.

SENATOR HARTNETT: And then in next year, 2005, you'll issue \$120 million bonds, and that I see that the...

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Senator Hartnett, can I quickly...I know this is your time. Could I explain something quickly?

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah, sure, yes, go ahead.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: I had a clue, just a clue, that we might need to start high and go low. So let's just put it out there that this plan would work for \$155 million for the judgment only. It would work...what I was trying to demonstrate, like is happening in 40 other states, I think somebody just handed us, Minnesota, \$465 million bond issue. You could use bonds to do the whole
