comments about not building roads anymore, I don't quite follow that. All right. So at any rate, my question is this. If you have a bond fund set up so that...and a critical part of my argument here is that come November 1, we're going to pay 10 percent interest, and I'm going to ask Senator Brashear to comment, because Senator Bromm, I think, raised a good question about whether that's true; but if that's true, then why would you not put yourself in a position so come November 1, you can pay 4 percent interest instead of 10 percent interest? What have you taken off the table? Again, you're not raising any tax rate. You're taking General Fund money because that's where the sales tax on new cars now, the half cent is, \$14 million a year or something like that, would be enough to service the bonding for the \$155 million or whatever it is. What have you taken off the table? All you're doing is prevented yourself from being stuck with a 10 percent interest rate. You still have completely open options to address it with income tax or address it with sales tax or address it with anything else that you think you can do. And if you want to do those things, implement the tax and pay off the bonds. All you're doing with this is preventing that situation where you're going to be stuck with a 10 percent interest rate instead of a 4 percent interest rate. It's simply a contingency. I would only implement it if the judgment comes down if, in fact, we're there. I'm not interested in starting it now in case maybe it happens and then using the money to fund schools or whatever, simply low-level waste. So that's my, I guess, question is the best way to describe it. And I would ask Senator Brashear if he would comment on the interest rate, whether or not 10 percent is a legitimate concern.
