Brashear probably has a idea here. Maybe, I don't agree with it. Used to be an old phrase, just you and me and the fence post. Well, most of these ideas, that's what there is. There's not a consensus. It might take 33, who knows what. But one thing about it, you know, we need some genius here to come up with a new way to devise how to pay for the things we want in this state. We have three, the same old three ways. The same, we argue about the three ways: sales tax, income tax and a few fees. That's what...we need some genius here to come up with a new way. I mean, we're not...it's the same, same thing over and over and over. How do I do it, sales tax, income tax or by fees? That's all we have. We need to come up with a new, unique way. What that is, I don't know. I'll go to you for the answer. But if you're really in question on this issue before us, I think who is going to tell us, it's going to be our phones. I think the phones, I think the people are going to get with us here. Just like Senator Schimek says, she's talked with some of them. I guess I didn't have any ideas, but somebody will. Your phones are going to start ringing here when they get the media tonight, they do their job and put it in the paper, and when this happens, this happens and it causes a domino effect, they're going to get with us and tell us what to do here. And I think they will dictate it in the end, sales tax, income tax, fees, or whatever. But there's just one thing about it, we have to do something. But we don't have to be in a great, big hurry. The best thing I've heard here all day...I hate to give him credit. He's not here; I will. He can't hear me. Senator Bourne said, let's don't get in any big hurry, we're going to negotiate this. That's good news, and it will be negotiated. The next best thing I heard was Senator Bromm's idea that we set our own tax...we set our own interest rate. Think of that. Ten percent isn't...God didn't say that. Or maybe he did, but we didn't hear him. But we set the rate. We set the rate. We can change it, as far as I'm concerned. It's the statute, I don't think it's in the constitution. So we can set the rate and maybe we can make it 4 percent. Why not? We did more foolish things than that in this body. It probably won't go to 4 percent, 5 percent, whatever. We can set our own rate if we have to go that route. We don't have the money to do it, we can negotiate. Senator Bourne...and until I'm told that's not possible, why I'll go along with that idea. Senator
