it, you're still going to need someplace between \$100 million and \$150 million next year, any way you look at it, so...to deal with our problems. So if everybody wants to do something but we can't agree upon what, then you and I and all of us have a struggle here for a little while longer. But I hope you're up to the task, because there's nothing left in this session that anywhere is nearly as important as what we're doing here now. I think we need to go back in the morning. I think that we can do some things quickly tomorrow that we couldn't do quickly today. I don't think...as we bring things up tomorrow, I don't think we need to have these long, long debates. We've all gotten to talk about our general philosophies. We've all gotten to talk about our specific philosophies, generally, at least with regard to surcharges and income taxes and bond financing. Maybe what we need to do tomorrow is start with the sales tax and have a short debate, an up or down vote on it. If there are not enough votes for the sales tax, then we know we've got to come to some compromises, right? Then we can run Senator Brashear's short version of bond financing. And that will be your last opportunity to solve the problem without a tax...a combination of tax increases of some type. And after that, my suggestion would be, then we look to a combination of sales, income, surcharge, some combination. And that will require each and every one of you to do a little bit of what you don't like, along with some of what you like. But I think that the public expects us to come to grips in a reasonable way with the problem. I think we expect each other to do that. And we probably have another tough day ahead of us tomorrow. But I think if we work at it with good will, we will...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...find a way. I think we all want to find a way. I think the public expects us to find a way. And I just hope you're all tough enough to stick it out and try to work through these things, and keep talking to each other about what is the right combination or the right solution. Thank you.
