the equation, and if we also take out of the equation perhaps setting aside reserves for the out years, is it absolutely necessary, or could we get by without raising taxes this year? And I believe that the answer that I heard was, yes, yes, we do have sufficient cash flow to get through this year without raising those taxes, without taking any of those three unpalatable options that are here before us. And so I would just posit that, that there is another option out there, there is another possibility out there. And granted, it's an option that may seem unpalatable to a lot of us here, and that being basically putting off a hard decision for another year. But it would appear, from our current financial situation, that we could get by without taking any of those options, and raising the taxes. That would fulfill our constitutional obligations that we have here as a Legislature to pass and to balance the budget. That would also get us through the next year. A lot of the discussion prior to Senator Hartnett's amendment centered around the low-level suit. And I happen to be one of those people that don't like what I'm seeing out of the district court and out of the Court of Appeals for the 8th Circuit. But I also feel that it would appear that that is a bill that has not yet become due from the state of Nebraska. And so as such, it would be something that we could put off to next year. Because even if you look at the various statutes and the constitutional provisions that we have here in the state of Nebraska to deal with a judgment that would be rendered against the state, if that happened, it would appear to me that if it's submitted to the Department of Administrative Services, pursuant to statute--and Senator Bromm talked about a statute that would accrue interest at 10 percent, that being Section 25-21211--that that wouldn't become ripe, or that wouldn't be something that the Legislature would deal with until the next regular session, that being next year. And so I guess the...if I could start a theme--and granted,...
