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going to challenge this one, then neither am I. But we're talking about a cash fund transfer bill. And the only amendment before us that actually transfers cash funds is Senator Brashear's. But let's talk about what the real problem is. The real problem is, how do we solve this \$160 million pending judgment, and when do we do that? Do we do that now? We have an economy that is recovering, recovering slowly. Do we do that now and have the unintended consequences of impairing that recovery by taking more money out of the citizens' pockets? Regardless of how laudable or how important the solution is, do we do that now? Do we do it in the form of a sales tax, income tax? Do we do it in the form of electrical surcharge? Do we do that now? That's a question before us. If you're going to say we shouldn't do anything at this time, that doesn't mean that you're not going to do something at a later time. And then some would argue, well, you're going to miss the opportunity to respond accordingly. Well, what is that opportunity? We as a state have gone down this path, saying we have done nothing wrong at all. We did everything right, maybe. We did...you know, now we're starting to back up, saying, well, maybe we did these wrong. And it's the Legislature that's responsible for making those decisions, and rightfully so. But in the idea that we're going to set aside money and go to a group of people that we have literally thumbed our noses at for the last so many years and say, could you please play nicely with us, I don't know that they're going to say, okay. I don't know that they're not going to...you know, how do we as a body say, well, if we do this, it's going to give us a better hand because we're trying to assume what the other side is going to accept? The reality is, we could set aside money ahead of time, prior to any final judgment, final settlement, and they could say, well, that's great, send us the full amount, but send us this amount now, and we'll figure out what happens. There's a lot of uncertainty. And I think the comments that have been made in the past day about, we're trying to solve a problem but we don't actually know what the full amount of the problem is. So that's the thing that I think is before us. And I think that's the thing that is...
