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SENATOR JANSSEN: Oh.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You said you believed there is no pot of gold.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Because it is a reflection of moisture; it's not a pot of gold.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, no, no, here's what I'm asking you. Then let me ask a question based on what you said. Is that your reason for saying there's no pot of gold at the end of the rainbow?

SENATOR JANSSEN: That's...yes, that's true. There isn't any.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Have you ever been at either end of a rainbow?

SENATOR JANSSEN: No. You never are.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So how do you know what is at the end of a rainbow or what is not at the end of a rainbow?

SENATOR JANSSEN: I believe it came from my biology or chemistry teacher when I was in school,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So you're going by what...

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...explaining reflection.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...you're going by what somebody else told you, not from what you know. Would you agree with that?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Oh, I've chased a lot of rainbows, but never got to the end of one.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So based on your personal knowledge, you don't know whether there's a pot of gold at the end of the rainbow or not, do you?
