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frankly, I don't think I will have to pay the full 30 years. I might check out or move out before that happens. My children and my grandchildren...Senator Landis, it's cruel to wave good-bye. My children and grandchildren (laugh) will pay it, and I don't think that that's what we need to do.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR TYSON: If we are going to do something, let's do it quick, quickly. The best of a bad string of ideas is the Beutler amendment. I'm going to support that verbally but I'm not going to support with a green light. I think we need to do nothing. I think the problem won't go away but we will be more able to accurately discern the size of the problem and perhaps come up with a better solution later. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Tyson. Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I think what Senator Brashear is trying to do here, from a business point of view, makes a lot of sense, and sometimes I think we should operate our state government a little more like a business. It makes a lot of financial sense. It does cover the obligation that we have. And I won't go into detail, but I've been hearing about that issue for at least 10 or 12 years, longer than that, closer to 20 years. But I'm going to support the Brashear amendment. With that, I'd give the rest of my time to Senator Brashear.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Who? Senator Brashear.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. Thank you very much, Senator Schrock. There are several things, since we have time (laugh); there are several things we could talk about but what I'm inclined to talk about, someone who sits very close to me and who shall remain nameless but, you know, you have to persuade those who are close to you first, has told me they would consider this bond deal if I could convince them that we aren't going to be able to just waive a magic wand and change the 10 percent interest rate. So it's amazing to me, if you look at this stuff a little bit, you know that wasn't
