it makes sense to start this process and hopefully we will not be paying 10 percent interest, it will be something less, if that's what it would turn out. But at least we will start down the road to prepare for this. And I'm hopeful that this will meet with some...a broad enough appeal to at least have 25 votes, and perhaps more. Maybe we'll need more. But I think this is the area that it continues our pay as you go, if you will. It is not going to saddle our children with this, with the payback, and probably more important, it isn't going to saddle...it isn't going to increase our future with interest. And the interest really does bother me. We fight very hard for a half a million dollars and a million dollars. These interest rates, at even the lowest rate, are going to be adding interest and we're probably not going to avoid interest after November 1 next year in whatever degree. So no matter what we do, and assuming we solve this within a couple years, which is what I think this does, we're still going to pay some interest, but at least, I hope, it will be somewhat reasonable. But we are going to be paying interest. We're paying hard-earned taxpayer money for interest, partly because perhaps of our procrastination. So I'm going to support this. There may be some details that I...I've just got the printout. Typically, when I wanted this to print out instantly it didn't work, so I haven't looked at it. But the general concept of a combination sales and income tax for a year, that will go away, to raise this, going...I assume it goes in the Cash Reserve, at least it goes into a payment or I think maybe Senator Beutler has changed that a little bit. It will go...we will start collecting that money and hopefully next year we will be sitting here appropriating that money in some kind of process that will go where it's supposed to go, and we can move on from there.
