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SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you. And, Senator Janssen, we're dealing with division one and that is specifically or solely or exclusively the income tax.

SENATOR JANSSEN: That's correct.

SENATOR BOURNE: And is it similar to Senator Hartnett's income tax amendment in that in Nebraska we have the four levels or four tiers and you're raising the lower three or what?

SENATOR JANSSEN: That's correct.

SENATOR BOURNE: And how much money does your income tax amendment generate on an annual basis?

SENATOR JANSSEN: The income tax would...\$51 million.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay, so \$51 million annually.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Right.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay. And are you allocating that to the potential judgment and its...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR BOURNE: And it goes into the Judgment Fund.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Correct.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay. So here...I assume that...I don't know if there's an emergency clause on the bill. Do you know when this bill would go into effect?

SENATOR JANSSEN: 2004.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay, sometime in 2004.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Uh-huh. Uh-huh.
