SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Bourne. Senator Janssen, your light is next.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Schimek. There will be no money coming in until people file in 19...or in '05. So, you know, and we still...we still wouldn't be up to the point we were prior to 1998. So if we...and I understand how the income tax schedule works, but, no, no money would come in until they file in '05. So I believe that we have to start setting something aside. Hey, if we...for some unforsaken reason they come down with a judgment that says, no, you know, you're not going to have to pay this, well, we can lower it again. If we raise it, we can lower it and go back to where we were. But I always believe that you better have an ace in the hole somewhere so that when they call their markers in, you better have something in place. This is what we've been hearing for the last two days. We've been arguing for two days on this bill. No one wants to come to a consensus. So I took the three things that we had talked about, put it in one bill. Well, one is gone. So you're, actually, you're probably going to end up with the income tax part. You know how things work in here. So it's a start. I believe it is something that the people in this state are going to have to pay. I would have liked to seen the surcharge. Senator Beutler wants to take that out. Well, hey, you know, from whence come you. This is waste that has come from us enjoying the rather low rates that we really do pay in this state. You know, you look at California, look at some of these other states. My gosh, you know, you can hardly afford to live in your own home, pay your light bill. It's terrible. But we actually have been pretty fortunate in this state, so if that...if we can end up with the income tax, so it takes us three years, I don't know how we're going to pay the judgment any other way, except for Senator Brashear's idea.
