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there were four people who thought that way, maybe there is the possibility of a majority yet, but maybe not. I'll withdraw the amendment temporarily and see what people are thinking. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is withdrawn. We're back to the Janssen amendment. Discussion. Senator Chambers, Janssen amendment AM1655 to LB 1090.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, Senator Janssen creates opportunities for us to liven up the discussion. It just happens that I was talking to somebody from his district the other day who had been in his store and was one of those people who, first of all, you all may not have heard it but Senator Janssen said when people come in his store they don't even look to see what the sales tax is. And I heard it's because they're watching for his thumb on the scale (laugh). They can't watch them both at the same time. Well, I told them that won't work because he packages all of his meat and puts the right weight and the price and the other necessary information. But anyway, he is right. I am opposed to the sales tax. This is one of those propositions that I know will not go anywhere today, but it gives the opportunity for us to discuss some of the things we've been talking about yesterday and today. I'm going to see what will become of Senator Beutler's amendment ultimately so I would like to ask him a question. Oh, he's not here right now. I was wondering if his amendment...oh, Senator Beutler, could I...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...Senator Beutler, would you yield to a question? I want to ask you about your amendment, if you don't mind. Mr. President, I would like to ask Senator Beutler a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler, would you...
