SENATOR CHAMBERS: And it's my time and I'm the interrogator and now I'm the "interrogatee." Carry on, Senator Beutler, yes, I will answer.

SENATOR BEUTLER: If the amendment were put back up and if the body saw fit to adopt it so that they could vote on the income tax and sales tax together, would you allow that to happen and not filibuster until the sun comes up,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Until the cows come home. Senator Beutler...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...it might give us a chance to vote on the matter.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Beutler, as has always been my practice and as has always been the case, the command of the body, the wish of the body is my command. So if you were to put...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Is it the command of 25 or the command of 33, Senator, that we need to deal with?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, now you're getting personal. But why don't we see what they might do? And that puts something else on the table for consideration. But if everything is speculative and everything is what if, then there's not much more that I will engage you in as far as discussion. But if something else happens that changes the dynamic, it could change other things.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's all I will ask Senator Beutler. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, what Senator Janssen is trying to do is an attempt to have a proposal that might address a problem that some people feel must be addressed now. That is to provide some money for the payment of that judgment. But what I will ask later is if that is taken care of, does that mean we will have no fiscal problems next session as a result of not enough revenue coming in or being...or a way being provided this session for revenue to come in?
