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SENATOR CUDABACK:        Thank you, Senator Chambers.        Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA:        Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I would like to ask Senator Janssen a question if I might.

SENATOR CUDABACK:        Senator Janssen, would you yield?

SENATOR JANSSEN:        Certainly.

SENATOR VRTISKA:        Senator Janssen, I've been listening all afternoon or all day, I guess, and what I'm hearing repeatedly is that we need \$161 million, is that correct?

SENATOR JANSSEN:        I'm sorry, Senator Vrtiska, I didn't get that. The sales tax?

SENATOR VRTISKA:        We need to pay off the obligation we've got on the low-level waste is to the tune of \$161 million. Is that correct?

SENATOR JANSSEN:        That's not...I have \$158 million.

SENATOR VRTISKA:        Pardon?

SENATOR JANSSEN:        \$158 million.

SENATOR VRTISKA:        \$158 million, okay.

SENATOR JANSSEN:        You were just short a little bit, or a little long.

SENATOR VRTISKA:        All right. Probably will be, but given that scenario that you're talking about and we've talked about continuously, if we go the route of a sales and income tax as they come in, interest is going to continue to collect. Right?

SENATOR JANSSEN:        That's what they say.

SENATOR VRTISKA:        So \$158 million isn't going to cut it.
