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maybe there is a compromise here that may be possible, as much as he dislikes the sales tax. So this is the big, far and away the biggest event of the session. If we take 15 more minutes, I hope that's not too much for you. And think about it again and see if you think that this matter doesn't face a filibuster, an everlasting filibuster, is it something worth doing yet tonight? Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bourne, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR BOURNE: I'd ask for a ruling from the Chair as to the...whether or not Senator Beutler's amendment is out of order. I think a more proper motion for that would be a reconsideration motion.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bourne. Senator Beutler, would you respond to Senator Bourne's question, if you'd like to.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, I think there's more than one way to approach a matter. It's simply not a reconsideration motion. You can choose to call it the same thing, but it's not the same motion. It's a different motion. It's a motion to amend, not a motion to reconsider.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Bourne, I am going to rule that it's basically the same and it should be a reconsideration motion. Senator Beutler is not responding. Senator Beutler, did you hear my...

SENATOR BEUTLER: I'm sorry, I didn't hear, Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: I did rule that it was basically the same and it should be considered as a reconsideration motion.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Mr. Clerk. Back to the Janssen amendment, AM1655. Discussion? Senator Quandahl.
