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FLOOR DEBATE

April 1, 2004 LB 1090

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I believe we're back onto Senator Janssen's and I believe this is the sales tax portion so I will address that, although I will speak in passing of Senator Beutler's amendment or motion to reconsider or whatever that was that just got pulled off. I guess my question and the question in my mind that's been kind of floating around for the last couple of days is whether these sort of amendments are actually germane to LB 1090 as it's currently drafted right now. And so that's a question so even if these do get attached to LB 1090, I would think that they would be subject to attack because I don't think they're germane. But that being said, I've been listening here today with everybody else and I've heard some fairly interesting impassioned speeches. I heard what Senator Stuthman said earlier, at about 5:00, and I agree with him 100 percent. I heard what Senator Bourne said and he, again, reiterates that he doesn't feel and I don't feel that it's absolutely necessary that we pass some kind of tax this year because if we do not...if we simply say no to sales taxes, say no to income taxes, say no to electrical surcharges, say no to gas taxes, that is an answer. We don't have to vote for a tax increase this year. Senator Pederson also came to the conclusion that what is the use of increasing a sales tax and an income tax if it's not going to solve any perceived problem that we have. And the amendment that's before you here right now would not solve any perceived problems or any problems that have been, I guess, enunciated on the floor up to this point. They wouldn't raise enough money to solve any perceived problem. And I would again say that I don't believe that there is a problem. And I do believe that sometimes just saying no is the correct answer. And I do think that that's the point that we're at right now. It is an option and it is a valid option to say no. If we look at what the Revenue Committee did this year, at the beginning of the session I believe I heard Senator Landis say that he did not believe that this body and that the state of Nebraska had the stomach for any more tax increases this year. I believe I heard him say that. And what happened in the Revenue Committee this year? The Revenue Committee did not put forth any sales tax increase that I know of, any income tax increase that I know this year, any electrical surcharge, any gas tax increase. The Revenue Committee did not come forth with any of those
