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be the only thing that we're looking at. I would not try to kill LB 1093 if it were before us right now, but it's not before us right now. So when it does come, I don't know what might come over me, but I am going to try to run \$1.07. And at that time, we can have the discussion and people can give their reasons why it should not be done. I would hope the 22 who supported it the other day would still be there and there were some people not here, I think, at the time we took the vote because I don't believe there were 49 of us. There might be three people, even three among those who voted no, who would be willing to come on for \$1.07. So I don't want anybody to be taken off guard. I don't want to blindside anybody on this. If there are people in the lobby who are going to try to kill it off, they have notice of what I'm going to try to do. Senator Wehrbein and I, during this time of the session, have been able to come to agreement on trying to get certain things done. We even came to a compromise on money going to the State Fair. He gets half on, I get half off. But at least we arrived at some kind of an accord on that. And this is despite the fact that Mr. Lloyd headed literally for the hills of Missouri and he'll be...his job will be three hours' drive from where his mother is located. But I'm sure that those are matters for him to consider. And it might have been good if he had just said, I'm out of Nebraska, I've got a better job offer, that's what I'm going to. Then there wouldn't be second guessing in the newspaper about other people as to what his true motivation was. But once something is out there in the public domain, people are going to think what they want to, they will say what they please, they will attribute motives to individuals. That is not going to have any part to play in what I will try to do whenever the State Fair issue comes up. But what I will use it for is to show that the savior, in a manner of speaking, to stay in line with what Mel Gibson has got the whole country thinking about, the savior has been crucified, but this savior cannot be resurrected. He's gone...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...without a trace. And if he was the salvation of the State Fair and the salvation is gone, the State Fair is through. But rather than take all of that \$306,000
