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no way of putting some of these comments together. One of the senators challenged Senator Janssen on his proposal as to when the income would come in, and it wouldn't come in till the first of the year. That senator said that would be too late. And the conclusion, let's put it off for a year. Now I really don't understand that kind of logic that putting anything off for a year is going to help us get the cash flow earlier, but that's what we hear. And I hear this about border bleed on tax that is 25 cents on \$100, 25 cents on \$100 is going to create border bleed. Well, I bleed for that. Then I hear just say no because we don't really have a crunch facing us. Hello. A \$300 million figure sitting out there and we don't have a crunch facing us. And again the solution that I hear, and I hope my voice portrays the frustration, is, well, let's wait till next winter and then we can, and this is what one of these persons said, I'm not naming anybody because I really, I don't want to make it personal, next winter we can tax twice as much in order to catch up. Well, let's not do a little bit. Let's not do something now that we know we're going to have to do. Let's just wait for it. Well, folks, I would ask us to drift back toward reality in our thoughts and our decisions. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Kruse. Senator Redfield, on the Janssen amendment.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I hope that you were all listening when Senator Quandahl spoke because he reminded the body that we do have a committee that has responsibility for revenue, and that, as a group, that committee chose not to send a tax increase to the floor. We have a Committee on Appropriations and they put together a proposal. And while some of us have questions and some of us have ideas, as a group we have honored their proposal. And I'm sure that different members of the Appropriations Committee have different ideas about certain elements in that plan, but overall we supported their proposal and their expertise. The Revenue Committee is made up of individuals who also have different viewpoints on different perspectives. I, for one, was one who could support Senator Beutler's surcharge. Others could not. Others liked other ideas. But as a group, we sent out to you no proposed tax increase. And I think there was a good reason for
