people are not letting me know definitely whether they are for doing nothing or otherwise. So I've been having people come up to me. I haven't written all their names down, because I'm not a snitch. But it seems that in the same way that during Abraham Lincoln's time, when he was running for an office, there was a group known as the "Know-Nothings," well, today we are plagued...well, I shouldn't say "plagued," we are facing the "do-nothings." I do not care if the Legislature decides to do nothing. I know that we will have problems next session, but we're going to have problems even if we do something. I doubt that any plan devised by anybody would get enough votes to do all that needs to be done to take care of paying off that potential judgment, I shouldn't say "potential judgment," the actual judgment, which potentially may rise to a higher amount, much higher than it is now, and to take care of shortfalls, those forecasts from that board that likes to spread doom and gloom over the Legislature and the state, but they're just doing their job. Such being the case, we may as well just wait until next year. Let's do like football coaches will do when they have a season that has really gone akimbo. There is no chance to make any bowl game. There is no chance to even win the conference. So you say, wait till next year. That's what we ought to go ahead and do. Let me tell you where I will benefit from that. When there are huge problems facing the state that must be addressed, other matters which ordinarily would have a high profile will not have such a high profile. We will be one year closer to the Governor's announcement that he's going to run for the U.S. Senate. I've already made it clear. If he messes with me, I'm going to try to mess over him. He's not going to have a glowing legislative record of achievement that he can hold up to the public and say, this is how I will show leadership in the U.S. Senate. He will have to say, I cannot even show leadership in the Legislature. He's going to bring some high-profile, politically charged issues to try to ram them down our throat. But he won't ram it down my throat, and I will fight him back politically. I will not offer a bill next session, so that I will not be in a position of having to withdraw any. And I will just be there watching, the cobra, steely-eyed, piercingly staring, and cobras don't blink, at the Governor, to see if he's going to get some unsuspecting senator to offer a bill that can derail him in terms of what he'll get
